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INTRODUCTION

- We had online classes from the beginning of this academic year due to the pandemic. But fortunately things settled and we started with the offline classes by 11/10/2021 for only Grade VIII th and IX th. From Grade VI th to IX th, regular offline classes began from 16/11/2021.
- On 7/02/2022 we started the regular Offline Classes for Grade III – V as well because we had received 90% of our parents giving consent for sending the children to school.
- The Offline classes helped us to bridge the gap which was created during the online classes.



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Academics

- The Principal, Vice Principal and HODs worked on the broad parameters for preparing the Annual Curriculum plan with a focus on learning outcomes, pedagogical strategies with special emphasis on Multiple Intelligences, Infusion of Life Skills and 21st century skills as well as Inter Disciplinary linkages.
- The Assessment Programme was worked out with emphasis on skill based assessment with continuous and comprehensive evaluation being the norm.
- Our students have done well in all the online assessments conducted over the year and there has been progression in all areas. The offline exams were more application based which helped the student and teacher identify where the gaps are and they could plan it out how to bridge the gaps.
