The system of education at DYPDSS, as you all know, is a blend of theory and practice in the right proportion to arrive at a comprehensive curriculum.

Outlined below are some of the achievements of the school in the year 2021-22.

Academics

The Principal, Vice Principal and HOD's worked on the broad parameters for preparing the Annual Curriculum plan with a focus on learning outcomes, pedagogical strategies with special emphasis on Multiple Intelligences, Infusion of Life Skills and 21st century skills as well as Inter Disciplinary linkages.

With the new challenges presented by COVID-19, we doubled down on our commitment to deliver excellence to all our students at DYPDSS.

We continued celebrating festivals, important days and events in preprimary during the online learning as well. Celebrations give students the opportunity to learn essential values and skills.

April

Due to COVID-19 situation the schools did not open in offline mode for academic session 2021-22, we started our virtual interactive academic sessions on Teams platform from the month of April.

In this month we celebrated different days and festivals like Gudi Padwa, Word Earth day, red colour day and virtual PTM.

<u>Gudi Padwa:</u> We asked students to dress up in a traditional attire, explained the significance of the festival with the help of Video and pictures and asked parents to share the pictures of their ward.



Red Colour Day: Red Colour symbolizes enthusiasm and vitality. The tiny tots looked stunning in their red outfits. All the students had kept many red coloured objects ready with them, displayed and named them one by one.

July
